To report water debris, go to <http://maps.floridadisaster.org/debris>. This will allow the Department of Environmental Protection to know where all the waterway debris is located. This is not for derelict vessels. Assessment teams are scouring the state's waterways for derelict vessel, leaking vessel, damaged or sunken vessels and potential hazards. FEMA Registration

FEMA representatives will be available to assist Clay County residents from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Saturday Sept 30th at the Middleburg Branch Library

- Know your Social Security Number
- Know the name of your insurance company, if applicable
- Damage Info (damage description)
- Financial Information (Income)
- Contact Information

Mosquito Control Report

We have sprayed 96% of the county (1,350 road miles) since last Thursday. We will finish our sweep of the entire county over the weekend. We are already getting calls about nuisance mosquitoes from zones that were recently sprayed. We will start deploying traps to these zones next week and begin respraying based on trap counts using our county truck and 3 contracted trucks. FDACS has concluded their assistance with mosquito control.

Road Closures / Road Work

The County Road 218 Bridge remains closed. An engineering firm has been contracted and a project timeline is forthcoming.

Road work on Henley Road is expected to be completed mid-December 2017. No left turns from Henley Road onto Russell Road will be allowed daily from 3:30 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. beginning Sept. 27
